(1) Thank reviewer your help. (2) My original abstract was not "17 industry". (3) I was revised abstract and article.
<u>Minor</u> REVISION comments	The paper will be improved if the authors added some information; (1) How many residents are employed in tourism industry (ex. the number of B & B / population in the island). (2) Photos that are used by some guide books (seashore, forest, hotels,...). (3) The map of Penghu Islands.	(1)Because the Jibei tourist industries, limited by the weather, only trading half year (rest for half a year), but only during the tourist season, when, some residents will return to work in the field work involved in tourism services on the island, but after September, many people left the island to take another job, so far, no detailed statistics of how many people actually engaged in tourism services. I can't find the data to answer your question and just ask the local tourist service providers and residents to provide data. (2) has added. (3) has added.
