<b><u>Compulsory</u></b> REVISION comments	It would be better to assess knowledge of pregnancy induced hypertension and to determine the influence of socio-demographic factors in the general population among pregnant women than in health facilities. Some key elements such as (i) the study level of these respondents, (ii) their marital status, (iii) the respective number of prenatal visits for each of them are not assessed. In addition, the questionnaire should be open and not based on univocal answers " Yes" or " No". The authors should use customised interviews and focus group in the communities of pregnant women instead of their 18 items questionnaire.	
<b><u>Minor</u></b> REVISION comments	In the introduction, authors should talk about the ANC attendance, the eventual barriers or bottle necks and the frequency of the visits per pregnant woman in this district.  About the parity, can authors put aside primiparous of the other and compare the different groups.	
<b><u>Optional/General</u></b> comments	The discussion appears brief and incomplete, it will be necessary to look for studies conducted in other African countries
