As to the best of literature review and our knowledge, there are no specific surgeries different from the routine inguinal hernia surgeries for management of pantaloona hernia. We have however, added discussion based on the recently published hernia management guidelines and few more details of the clinical presentation and management of our patient. There were no other references for pantaloona hernia in literature that could be cited.
