Compulsory REVISION comments	Since this is a report, the tenses should be in the PAST. The authors should please read through and convert the present tenses to the past as there are a lot of such errors spanning through almost all the sections of this manuscript.	
	For example, line 34 "is should be " was" Line 34has Line 35is Lines 37, 38, 39, and 40 "is" should be changed to " was" e.t.c	
	The section of the "Final diagnosis" and "Treatment" should be incorporated under the section of "Case report"	
	The manuscript lacks a "conclusion". The author should provide a justified conclusion, and possibly an evidence-based recommendation, lessons learnt, and how the information provide could be applied to practice.	
Minor REVISION comments	Several of the statements of fact between lines 210 and 220 will require citations. I will recommend that every statement between the mentioned lines should ascribed at least one citation.	
Optional/General comments	This is an interesting report. However, I will suggest that it should be reviewed by a native English speaker for tenses, grammar, punctuations, syntax etc.	
	For instance, lines 209-212 may be rephrased to read thus: Also implicated in the etiology of cutaneous vasculitis are viruses such as Hepatitis B [ref], HIV [ref], as well as food and food additives [ref].
