Line 134 "sperms" change to spermatozoa Line 141: Figure 1 is a mess: "frequenc? Change "percentage" to "%", adjust labels so that they are not on top of each other (as they are now, I cannot read the figure). Line 196: It looks like heroin use was a significant effector, p=0.5 Line 202 change to "findings are" Line 213: change this sentence: "According to Sanjay *et al.*, (2008), obesity/overweight may result in hypogonadism, increased scrotal temperatures, impaired spermatogenesis, decreased sperm concentration and motility, and increased sperm DNA damage and men presenting with a BMI greater

than 25 kg/m<sup>2</sup> have fewer chromatin-intact normal-motile sperm cells per ejaculate and therefore, to ensure maximum fertility potential, patients may be advised to reduce body weight (Hilton *et al.*, 2006)." Line 309: change to "includes"

Line 322: (bad sentence) "Lipid levels was had no influence on sperm characteristics in this setting." The authors should state that the marijuana effect may arise from small subgroup size.
