Only minor revisions are required which I have mentioned below.</p> <p>1. abstract section: second line: write” head and neck region”, instead of “head and neck”</p> <p>2....reported in Russia. use “;” in appropriate place, instead of using comma only</p> <p>3.Any nasopharyngeal pathologies can precipitate COM and Nashopharyngeal lymphangioma is no exception. Use this sentence appropriately, at the end of introduction part.</p> <p>4.Case report section: use uniform terminology in the manuscript. Use either “Chronic otitis media” or “chronic suppurative otitis media”. You can use “COM/CSOM” in subsequent sentences.</p> <p>5.use uniform terminology i.e. either “Mucoid” or “mucopurulent” discharge. Mucopurulent would be better in the given scenario.</p> <p>6. on probing: was it fragile... bleeding on touch or not ? consistency?</p> <p>7. “Contrast enhanced CT (CECT)” would be better.
