Refrain from using the word diabetics – this stigmatises patients. rather use the words "patients with diabetes" Avoid use word like mgt – this is a scientific journal – full words essential Refrain from repeating all what you have in the table – only describe pertinent findings Remember to comment on both IDF and WHO guidelines on optimal diabetes control For significance did you use < 0.05 or ≤ 0.05? Try to group findings from developed versus developing countries hence literature review not complete especially from Africa and South Africa in particular P values should be listed as <0.05 not p=0.000 I would re do discussion making it more reader friendly Ethical issue: Need ethics reference number
