<u>Compulsory</u> REVISION comments	<p>Sentence repetition in abstract.</p> <p>Gillie's temporal approach and active physiotherapy should be removed from keywords.</p> <p>Where the framing of sentences is not appropriate.</p> <p>How 3D CT scan is come under initial investigation?? Is it available at all trauma centres? Sentence should be changed accordingly.</p> <p>In given article, only reference of two pubmed article is mentioned for reported cases in literature while there is one more recent article which can be added in reference (Fractures of the mandibular coronoid process: A two centres study by Paolo Boffano)</p> <p>The case report section needs to be written properly.</p> <p>Moreover, the treatment is not described properly, how arch stabilize?? Any external fixation ?? A proper treatment procedure must be stated for completeness of the case.</p> <p>In figure 2. How depression is seen in presence of swelling ?</p>	
<u>Minor</u> REVISION comments	<p>It also has spelling mistakes like the word `Trismus' is misspelled in line no. 46 below figure 2 and comminuted in line no. 84.</p> <p>Retromandibular approach is through posterior border of parotid and not through anterior border.</p>	



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<u>Optional/General</u> comments	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- The case report section can be written in brief and the discussion section can be more elaborated like discussion of other treatment option for coronoid fracture- For incidence you can refer article titled "Mandibular coronoid fractures, how rare??" by TP kale who reported slightly higher incidences in their study.
