I suggest the following: Use graphs to show this, place pain at the end – showing the benefits first.</li> <li>2. It appears that while range increased significantly when teres major work was done, pain and GROC measurements were the same. You should comment on this in the discussions.</li> <li>3. You probably are writing a little too much about the soft tissue technique in the discussion. The bit about Travell can go in the introduction. Write a little more about the results of your study.</li> <li>4. You did the Constant Murley test, but there were no changes in this functional measure. You need to comment on this.</li> </ol>
