They are shown as common food or nutrients, but their chemical reactions on body, metabolism or on the Nervous System are not mentioned. - Chinese Medicine also consider herbs and plants so important for their medical treatment, however, anything is said in the manuscript. - Line 95: it is written "the data were spread on Excel...", however, any numerical data comparison is shown in the manuscript, not graphs. - Equivalence of natural product with pharmaceutical or chemical compounds would be recommended to explain. Or at least, mentioning some of those drugs that are mimicking the plant effects. - Lines 226-229 is written the danger of extinction for this traditional medicine, however any suggestion to prevent or to keep that knowledge as preserving measures are mentioned. 	<p>The author meant the medicinal plants are used as therapeutic purposes for various diseases.</p> <p>Alternative or complementary medicine are used by the Chinese for the management of diseases. this were identified and incorporated as suggested.</p> <p>Means and Percentages were used for analysis and comparison of the data generated.</p> <p>The scope of the work was survey and not on the phytochemical analysis. Further studies will be based on this.</p> <p>Suggestions were incorporated as directed.</p>
