<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<p>The article presents an interesting topic, which is the presence of heavy metals in the water. Nevertheless, in the methodology, the authors report that they determined the presence of these metals in two plants, but they do not explain why. Why not measure directly from the water? If the authors wanted to analyze the accumulation of these metals in plants, then this should be further explored.</p> <p>The manuscript presents several problems of formatting, English language and nomenclature of scientific names. The methodology is poorly described and the study time was only three months, insufficient to draw robust conclusions.</p> <p>The authors do not present the discussion of the results, appearing to be only an observation report in the field.</p>
