<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<p>This manuscript serves mostly as an overview of literature, showing that health care expenditure in Nigeria is very low when compared to other developing nations in Africa. Indeed, the factors that limiting Nigeria's health outcomes are both demand and supply-side, including inadequate financing, weak governance and enforcement, inadequate infrastructure and poor service quality, household poverty and insufficient risk pooling.</p> <p>Finally, the author(s) suggest(s) that increasing national investment in health sector (and especially in primary prevention), the quality of healthcare services in Nigeria will increase, resulting to an overall improvement of national productivity.</p> <p><b>Major revision comments (about the format of the manuscript):</b>The manuscript is written in the form of several sub-sections which are included in <b>onlyone</b> large section. This only section is in fact the entire manuscript and it does <b>not even have a title</b> (the manuscript begins immediately with sub-section 1.1). Please revise the sectioning of the manuscript by considering an introductory section, some consecutive sections, as well as a conclusion or discussion section at the end. If it is then necessary you can break some sections to sub-sections for better readability.</p>

It is included in the References section but it does not have a publication year. Please provide full published descriptions (including year) for all your citations in your text and in the References section.</p> <p><b>Line 25:</b> The same comment as above for "...Analysis in the African Region, n.d.)". If you are referring to some items in the References section, please provide also the published year (like in lines 30-31).</p> <p><b>Page 2.</b></p> <p><b>Line 41:</b> Please delete the extra comma at the begging of this line.</p> <p><b>Page 3.</b></p> <p><b>Line 64:</b> Please rewrite as "The Private Out-Of-Pocket-Expenditure(OOPE)...".</p> <p><b>Page 5.</b></p> <p><b>Line 117:</b> Please rewrite as "...at birth is 38.3 years;" (add a blank space after 38.3).</p> <p><b>Page 6.</b></p>

Please rephrase, or summarize the paragraph in lines 165-168 in order not to be an exact copy of lines 38-41.</p> <p><b>Page 10.</b></p> <p><b>Line 210:</b>Please rewrite as "...asFigure 1 below shows.".</p> <p><b>Line 217:</b> Please add a figure caption under the figure. For example you can write "Fig. 1. The vicious healthcare cycle of the poor.".</p> <p><b>References section:</b></p> <p>Please re-check carefully all the links and correct them to be in working order. For example, in lines 295-296 the link was broken (there is a space between "executive-" and "secretary&amp;catid=34:home").
